- ◆ **All divisions will be ridden together in the same class however each division (Junior, Adult Amateur and Open) will be pinned separately - 1st through 6th place ribbon in each class.**
- ◆ Any person (Junior or Senior) who gives riding instruction, and/or receives compensation for riding or training, is considered a professional and, as such, is **ONLY** eligible for Open divisions. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- ◆ The show management reserves the right to vary or change show officials or judges, to decline any entry, and cancel, divide or combine classes.
- ◆ The USEF Equestrian Handbook will be used as a general guideline for these shows using the 2007 Tests.
- ◆ Exhibitors are encouraged to leave their dogs at home. Any dog brought to the show grounds must remain leashed at all times.
- ◆ Show ride times will be posted on our website, [www.crdressage.org](http://www.crdressage.org) no later than the Thursday prior to the show. Once ride times are posted, they are final.
- ◆ No refunds after closing date.

CRDA offers a year-end awards program to competitors. Awards are given for the following divisions:

<b>Intro Level:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Training Level Test 1 &amp; 2:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Training Level Test 3 &amp; 4:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>First Level:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Second Level and Above:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Musical Freestyle:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Leadline:</b>	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR ONLY</b> )
<b>Above Leadline:</b>	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR ONLY</b> )
<b>USEA TOC:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Riders w/Disabilities:</b>	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> )
<b>Vintage:</b>	50 to 59 Years of age – 3 scores by 2 different judges, <u>all scores used</u> . ( <b>AA ONLY</b> ).
<b>Tower Hill Master:</b>	60+ Years of age – 3 scores by 2 different judges, <u>all scores used</u> . ( <b>AA ONLY</b> ).
<b>Overall High Point:</b>	<u>Combination of all scores</u> received at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges ( <b>JR, AA, OPEN</b> ).

Competitors must meet the following criteria to receive a year-end award:

- Rider must be a member of CRDA in good standing (dues paid and up to date prior to the show date) for scores to count.
- Must have contributed at least **4** hours of volunteer time to CRDA during the year and returned a signed volunteer form to Carol Burkhart by November 1, 2010.
- Horse/rider combination must compete in a minimum of 2 CRDA shows in the same division, with two different judges, during the 2010 show year. The combination's top 3 scores from a minimum of 2 different shows will be used to determine divisional year-end placing.
- Overall awards are combination of all scores during the 2010 year; with a minimum of 3 scores from 2 CRDA shows with 2 different judges.
- Any person (junior or senior) who gives riding instruction, and/or receives compensation for riding or training, is considered a professional and, as such, is only eligible for Open classes.
- Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be given in each division if entries warrant.
- Awards and other honors will be presented at the Annual Banquet.
- Musical Freestyle, Lead Line Class and Above Lead Line Class will be based on average of 2 highest scores.
- Awards will be divided into Open, Junior, Adult Amateur, Musical Freestyle.
- Masters Year End Award is sponsored by Tower Hill Farm.
- Note: Riders 50 – 59 are eligible for the Vintage award, while those 60 and over are eligible for the Tower Hill Masters award. Riders are not eligible to win in both categories.
