# Entry Costs:

Office Fee: \$15 per entry

Late Fee: \$30 for entries received after the closing date. Entries after the closing date are accepted only as space allows.

Change Fee: \$25

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: No refunds will be issued <u>after</u> the closing dates. Unconditionally, no refunds after closing date for "acts of god" which require management to cancel classes or day(s) of competition.

Refunds will be given for cancellations received in writing or emailed on or before the closing date less the office fee.

#### Stabling:

There will be a LIMITED number of overnight and day stalls available. First come, first serve. Day stall: \$45

\*\*If you volunteer more than 4 hours at the show, then your stall is free for that day.\*\* Overnight stall: \$60

Please bring own shavings, hay and buckets.

Must clean stall or pay \$75 cleaning fee per stall.



Stalls can be purchased with entry at <u>www.horseshowoffice.com</u>. This option will be available until the limited number of stalls are reserved.

You will still need to bring your own shavings, hay, buckets and clean the stall or paid the \$75 cleaning fee.

**Lunging**: Will be allowed at all shows in the specified area.

#### <u>Ribbons</u>:

All divisions will be ridden together in the same class. However, each division (Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open) will be pinned separately. Ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> place.

Please pick up your tests and ribbons. Tests that are not picked up will be mailed, or, if the competitor agrees, can be scanned and emailed after the show. CRDA cannot mail ribbons left behind, but will gladly have those ribbons at a subsequent show for pick-up.

For Divisions:

--Junior riders: defined as the beginning of the calendar year until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18;

--Open riders: any person (Junior or Senior) who gives riding instruction, and/or receives compensation for riding or training, is considered a professional and is eligible only for the Open division. Please note: there are no exceptions to this rule.

Each division is awarded a High Percentage Champion and Reserve Champion at each show. Scores will be included from classes 1-15.

# <u>Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.)</u>:



CRDA is pleased to announce its 2024 affiliation with The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.), which encourages the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding.

T.I.P. registrants will be eligible for the **Junior High Point** (18 years or younger as of January 1, 2024) and **Overall High Point** awards in any Introductory, Training, First, Second level and above, and Eventing Test of Choice classes at each of our in-person shows.

For calculation of High Score awards, when calculating the award winners, we will add the following percentage points to the final score to reflect the increased degree of difficulty of the test level as follows:

--Training Level and Eventing Test of Choice +1

--First Level +2

--Second Level and above +3

2024 Schooling Show Prize List March 7, 2024 In order to be eligible for a T.I.P. award, owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To register your Thoroughbred and riders with the T.I.P Program, please go to the Jockey Club T.I.P. Website at tjctip.com. There is no cost to register, and your horse may have multiple riders as long as each rider is registered with the horse. The Jockey Club also offers Horse ID assistance for owners having trouble obtaining their TB's identification number.

To be eligible submit a copy of the T.I.P.'s number card to our CRDA T.I.P. coordinator Julie Blackburn at providenceriding@gmail.com or give a printed copy to the show secretary on the day of the show.

CRDA will also offer T.I.P. Year End Awards for the above two categories.

# Show Information:

- 1. CRDA Schooling Shows are run in accordance with USEF Rules. Proper show attire is expected.
- 2. Horse number must be worn at all times; this includes while being lead with a halter/lead.
- 3. All riders must wear properly fastened ASTM approved protective headgear at all times while mounted.
- 4. The show management reserves the right to vary or change show officials or judges, to decline any entry, and cancel, divide or combine classes.
- 5. Exhibitors are encouraged to leave their dogs at home. Any dog brought to the show grounds must remain leashed at all times.
- 6. Show ride times will be posted on our website, www.crdressage.org no later than the Wednesday prior to the show.
- 7. Judges are TBD. Please check the CRDA website (www.crdressage.org) for names of judges.

#### Year-End Awards:

CRDA has a great year-end awards program for competitors. Awards are given for the following classes for a horse and rider combination:

Intro Level (any test): Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Training Level (any test): Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) First Level (any test): Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Second Level and Above: Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Musical Freestyle: Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Leadline: Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Above Leadline: Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR ONLY) USEA TOC: Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) Riders w/Disabilities: Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)

Vintage: 50 to 59 Years of age (see details below) – Average of all scores, minimum of 3 scores by 2 different judges. (all divisions rated together).

Master: 60+ Years of age (see details below) – Average of all scores, minimum of 3 scores by 2different judges. (all divisions rated together).

CRDA also has the following Rider High Point awards:

Overall High Point: Average of all scores received at a minimum of 3 tests, at 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN). (Can be ridden on multiple horses)

<u>**T.I.P. Overall Junior High Point**</u> (18 years or younger as of January 1, 2023) and <u>**Overall High**</u> <u>**Point**</u>.

# Year-End Award Criteria for eligibility:

- 1. In each level, rider's eligible scores are taken from any of the tests available at that level.
- 2. Rider must be a member of CRDA in good standing (dues paid prior to the show date) for scores to count.
- 3. Must have contributed at least 4 hours of volunteer time to CRDA during the year. Show volunteer's hours are tracked by the Volunteer Coordinator. For volunteer time at other events, please make sure to return a signed volunteer form to the Volunteer Coordinator by September 30, 2024.
- 4. CRDA Member Volunteer hours (Adult & Child) may be completed by a family member or friends on your behalf. You must let the Volunteer Coordinator know in advance of the show or event that the person is being your proxy and complete the required form.
- 5. All volunteer hours MUST be completed by 09/30/2024.
- 6. Leadline, Above Leadline, Prix Caprilli, and Musical Freestyle scores are not eligible for Overall Rider High Point award calculations.

- 7. Ribbons to be awarded to Champion, Reserve Champion, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th place (if entries warrant).
- 8. Awards and other honors will be presented at the Annual Banquet.
- 9. Awards will be divided into Open, Junior, and Adult Amateur.
- 10. Riders are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- 11. Riders are eligible for the Vintage Year End Award starting January 1st when the rider is 50 years old.
- 12. Riders are eligible for the Masters (and no longer the Vintage) Year End Award starting January 1st when the rider is 60 years old.
