IMPORTANT SHOW INFORMATION:

- ◆ CRDA Schooling Shows are run in accordance with USEF Rules. Proper show attire is expected.
- ◆ Horse number must be worn at all times; this includes while being lead with a halter/lead.
- ◆ All competitors and riders must sign the Apple Knoll Farm Release & Indemnity Agreement once per year and return it to the Show Secretary. This form can be obtained in the Omnibus, at the CRDA website (www.crdressage.org) or the horseshow office at Apple Knoll Farm. If using Horse Show Office to submit an entry forms can be scanned with the entry, or emailed to the show secretary.
- ◆ All divisions will be ridden together in the same class however each division (Junior, Adult Amateur and Open) will be pinned separately - 1st through 6th place ribbon in each class.
- ◆ Each division is awarded a High Percentage Champion and Reserve Champion at each show. Scores will be included from classes 1-15
- ◆ Riders are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- ◆ Please check the CRDA website (www.crdressage.org) for Leadline and Above Leadline Tests.
- ◆ **All riders must wear properly fastened ASTM approved protective headgear at all times while mounted.**
- ◆ Any person (Junior or Senior) who gives riding instruction, and/or receives compensation for riding or training, is considered a professional and, as such, is ONLY eligible for Open divisions. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- ◆ The show management reserves the right to vary or change show officials or judges, to decline any entry, and cancel, divide or combine classes.
- ◆ ** For any class noted as TOC, you must specify the Level and Test number. (e.g. 3rd Level Test 3). Only Level is required for the Dressage Rider Test Class #19.
- ◆ Exhibitors are encouraged to leave their dogs at home. Any dog brought to the show grounds must remain leashed at all times.
- ◆ Show ride times will be posted on our website, www.crdressage.org no later than the Monday prior to the show.
- ◆ No refunds after closing date.
- ◆ Judges are TBD. Please check the CRDA website (www.crdressage.org) for names of judges.
- ◆ Limited stalls are available at \$30/day on a 1st come 1st serve basis. Stalls must be left in same condition as on arrival. Add your stabling requests to the entry form and include the amount in the check to CRDA. Volunteers are NOT guaranteed a stall. Please indicate if you plan on volunteering for 4 hours (if so you can waive your stabling fee).
- ◆ Apple Knoll Farm sells hay & shavings. Contact them directly to purchase - www.appleknollfarm.com
- ◆ We need you! CRDA shows rely on volunteers and prior experience is not necessary. We can provide a day stall free of charge to any competitor who volunteers 4 hours or more during the show day. Please contact Ellen Straus (estraus108@hotmail.com) if you are interested in volunteering.

Year-End Awards Criteria

CRDA has a great year-end awards program for competitors. Awards are given for the following divisions:

Intro Level (any test):	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Training Level (any test):	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
First Level (any test):	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Second Level and Above:	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Musical Freestyle:	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Leadline:	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR ONLY)
Above Leadline:	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR ONLY)
USEA TOC:	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Riders w/Disabilities:	Average of 3 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Prix Caprilli:	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Dressage Riders Test:	Average of 2 highest scores at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN)
Vintage:	50 to 59 Years of age – 3 scores by 2 different judges, <u>all scores used</u> . (all divisions rated together) .
Tower Hill Master:	60+ Years of age – 3 scores by 2 different judges, <u>all scores used</u> . (all divisions rated together) .
Overall High Point:	<u>Average of all scores</u> received at a minimum of 2 shows by 2 different judges (JR, AA, OPEN) .

Competitors must meet the following criteria to receive a year-end award:

- In each level, rider's eligible scores are taken from any of the tests available at that level.
- Rider must be a member of CRDA in good standing (dues paid prior to the show date) for scores to count.
- Must have contributed at least 4 hours of volunteer time to CRDA during the year.
- **Volunteer hours MUST be completed by the member themselves. In the event a member is 10 years of age or under, a family member or friend may volunteer on their behalf. Notice that hours are being done for a child must be communicated up front and prior to the start of the volunteer hours.**
- All volunteer hours must be completed and submitted no later than the final show of the series. For 2017 that date is **OCTOBER 1st**. All volunteer hours after this date will be submitted for the 2018 season so plan accordingly.
- Show volunteer's hours are tracked by Ellen Straus. For volunteer time at other events, please make sure to return a signed VOLUNTEER FORM to Ellen by October 1, 2017.
- Horse/rider combination must compete in a minimum of 2 CRDA shows in the same division, with two different judges, during the current show year. The combination's top 3 scores from a minimum of 2 different shows will be used to determine divisional year-end placing.
- Overall awards are an average of all scores during the current year; with a minimum of 3 scores from 2 CRDA shows with 2 different judges. Leadline, Above Leadline, Dressage Rider Tests, Prix Caprilli, and Musical Freestyle scores are not eligible for Overall award calculations.
- Masters awards are an average of all scores during the current year; with a minimum of 3 scores from 2 CRDA shows with 2 different judges. Leadline, Above Leadline, Dressage Rider Tests, Prix Caprilli, and Musical Freestyle scores are not eligible for Masters award calculations.
- Vintage awards are an average of all scores during the current year; with a minimum of 3 scores from 2 CRDA shows with 2 different judges. Leadline, Above Leadline, Dressage Rider Tests, Prix Caprilli, and Musical Freestyle scores are not eligible for Vintage award calculations.
- Any person (junior or senior) who gives riding instruction, and/or receives compensation for riding or training, is considered a professional and, as such, is only eligible for Open classes.
- (Great) Prizes for Champion and Reserve Champion.
- Ribbons to be awarded to Champion through 6th place (if entries warrant).
- Awards and other honors will be presented at the Annual Banquet.
- Dressage Riders Tests, Musical Freestyle, Prix Caprilli, Leadline Class and Above Leadline Class will be based on average of 2 highest scores.
- Awards will be divided into Open, Junior, and Adult Amateur. Riders are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- Masters Year End Award is sponsored by Tower Hill Farm.
- Note: Riders 50 – 59 are eligible for the Vintage award, while those 60 and over are eligible for the Tower Hill Masters award. Riders are not eligible to win in both categories.
